

KNOW and GROW → Week 2 Schedule and Questions:

Monday January 11 Genesis 6

- The “sons of God” married the “daughters of men.” That probably means *believers* married *unbelievers*, which led to much sin and the flood. Good advice → 2 Corinthians 6:14-18.
- *The ark was huge!* Write its dimensions here: _____ feet long, _____ feet wide, and _____ feet high. God knows best, so *similar proportions are still used in ocean-going vessels today!*
- How much did Noah respond to God? Some Mostly Completely

Tuesday January 12 Genesis 7

- How old was Noah when the flood began? _____ years old
- Notice that there were “kinds” on the ark; not every species known today *but the kinds that could bring forth every species.* For example, the DNA from a wolf produced every kind of dog.
- Were dinosaurs on the ark? (Note “every” in 7:14) Y N
- How many days did water cover all the earth? _____ days

Wednesday January 13 Genesis 8

- “But God remembered...” – even in our lives it can seem like God has forgotten *but He will certainly keep all of His promises!*
- How long before the earth was “completely dry”? (See 7:11; then 8:13-14) _____ year and _____ days

Thursday January 14 Genesis 9

- In Genesis 1 God gave people plants and fruit to eat (29); then, after the flood, God said: “I now give you _____.”
- Does God support capital punishment for the crime of murder? Y N A murderer shows contempt for man and God (9:6).
- Will God ever destroy all life on earth again with a flood? Y N

Friday January 15 Genesis 10

- Be fruitful and multiply; God gave that command to Adam and Eve (1:28); then to Noah’s family (9:7); chapter 10 documents God’s blessing of reproduction. *Give thanks to the Giver of life!*
- *God is able to bring so many from so few!* “The 14 nations that came from Japheth plus the 30 from Ham and the 26 from Shem add up to 70, perhaps in anticipation of the 70 members of Jacob’s family in Egypt.” (CSSB – Concordia Self-Study Bible)

KNOW and GROW → Week 3 Schedule and Questions:

Monday January 18 Genesis 11

- “Come, let us build ourselves a city...” The people were unified by language, growing in numbers, and proud in their hearts; *they may have felt invincible!* But God confused their language for their benefit – *to humble them and call them to faith!*
- Since all people today came from Noah’s family – even from Adam and Eve – they probably had one language and a similar skin color through Genesis 11. When God changed the languages, those who moved toward the equator became darker, the opposite became lighter. *We are ALL ONE RACE!*
- The second unbroken genealogy → *Shem to Abram*; by totaling both lists, we count 1,946 years from creation to Abram’s birth.

Tuesday January 19 Genesis 12

- What nation did God make from Abram? _____
- How could “all peoples on earth” possibly be blessed through Abram? (See Galatians 3:6-9) _____
- Why did Abram lie about Sarai? _____

Wednesday January 20 Genesis 13

- Why did it become necessary for Abram and Lot to live in separate areas? _____
- When given a choice, Lot chose to live near _____, where the men were _____ and were _____ greatly against the Lord. *Let’s NOT flirt with temptation!*

Thursday January 21 Genesis 14

- Abram – *with God’s blessing* – rescued Lot, his possessions, and other people; then Melchizedek blessed Abram. To honor God for the victory, “Abram gave him a tenth of everything.” *How are you honoring the Lord?* _____

Friday January 22 Genesis 15

- Then and today, we are righteous by grace through _____.
- God assured Abram he would receive the land He promised *by symbolically passing in between the animal halves.* In other words, God said: May I become like these animals if I do not do what I have promised. *The true God is worthy of ALL our trust!*

Answers:

Genesis 6:

- Marriage advice: See 2 Corinthians 6:14-18
- Ark: 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, 45 feet high
- Completely, everything, see v. 22

Genesis 7:

- 600 years old, see v. 6
- Dinosaurs are land animals which God created on the sixth day of creation. They are certainly included in v. 14
- 150 days, see v. 24

Genesis 8:

- When Noah was 600 – *second month, seventeenth day* to when Noah was 601 – *second month, twenty-seventh day* = 1 year and 10 days

Genesis 9:

- Everything (hotdogs!), v. 3
- Yes, see v. 6; Romans 12:19; 13:3-4
- No, see v. 15

Answers:

Genesis 11:

- Red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in His sight!

Genesis 12:

- The nation of Israel
- God finally brought the Savior promised to Adam & Eve (as first noted in 3:15) into the world through the line of Abram. So, through Abram, all peoples on earth are blessed – at least are offered the greatest blessing of all, even though many continue to reject God's precious gift of salvation.
- Abram feared for his life; he feared men more than God, so he lied. See Matthew 10:28

Genesis 13:

- They were TOO blessed – with possessions, see vv. 5-7
- Sodom, wicked, sinning

Genesis 14:

- We honor the Lord by *trusting Him* and *giving first to Him*, in proportion to what we have received.
- Those who give less than a tithe are robbing from God, while those who faithfully tithe are richly blessed. See Malachi 3:9-10

Genesis 15:

- Faith, see Romans 3:20-22, 28
