- Why did the Lord send Moses and some elders ahead to find the water? _____

- Moses was trying to help the people, so why did Jethro say: it "is not good"? _____
- Notice Jethro's advice: "...select _____ men...and appoint them as _____ over...hundreds, _____, and _____." Bethlehem has about 115 family units; *please pray for capable people to work with your pastor!*

Thursday June 10 Exodus 19

- Why did the Lord want the people to hear Him speaking to Moses? _____
- Let's remember that God is holy, but we are not of ourselves – *only in Jesus!* What was the penalty for touching the mountain when God was on it? _____

Friday June 11 Exodus 20

- Why should people *try their best* to keep the Ten Commandments? _____
- Do you fear, love, or trust ANYTHING more than God? Y N *In all such areas, God is calling us to repent!*

Answers:

Exodus 11:

- “Every [firstborn](#) son in Egypt will [die](#).” (5)
- Yes – the Egyptians would wail worse than ever, but among the Israelites not even a dog will bark at any man or animal. Now, think about what the Bible says regarding the differences between *believers* and *non-believers* in eternity!

Exodus 12:

- Jesus is the Lamb of God who has taken away the [sin](#) of the [world](#).
- “[males without defect](#)” – Jesus is without sin; “[slaughter them at twilight \[as the sun declines\]](#)” – Jesus died at 3:00 p.m.; “[the blood \[spared their physical lives\]](#)” – Jesus’ blood purifies from all sin; “[Do not break any of the bones](#)” – neither were Jesus’ bones broken in His crucifixion.
- “...when I see the blood, I will pass over you.” (13)
- “...there was not a [house](#) without someone [dead](#).” (30)

Exodus 13:

- See 1 Corinthians 6:19-20
- See Psalm 119:105

Exodus 14:

- “The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still.” (14)
- Regarding “the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed the Israelites into the sea. Not one of them survived.” (28)

Answers:

Exodus 16:

- See Psalm 145:16; Romans 8:32; Philippians 4:19
- Some of the people failed by taking too much, thus not trusting the Lord to provide again the next day. Think about the fourth petition of the Lord’s Prayer...
- *For 40 years!* Can you imagine that?

Exodus 17:

- So the people would begin to listen to Moses, the Lord’s called servant!
- So the people would trust in the Lord – *knowing He was ultimately giving the victory* – and not in themselves!

Exodus 18:

- Moses was trying to do an impossible task – “[The work is too heavy for you; you cannot handle it alone](#).” (18)
- “...select [capable](#) men...and appoint them as [officials](#) over...hundreds, [fifties](#), and [tens](#).”

Exodus 19:

- “...so that the people...will always put their trust in you [as their appointed leader].” (9)
- Those who do so “shall surely be put to death.” (12)

Exodus 20:

- NEVER to earn or even help oneself get to heaven, see Romans 3:20; instead, *to honor the Lord who has given us the gift of heaven!*
- Even though we are forgiven in Christ, we should still be dead serious about knowing and following God’s Holy Word; see Isaiah 66:2.
