### Many Events of Jesus' Life in Chronological Order:

- Born (5 BC)
- Named when 8 days old
- Presented at the Temple when 40 days old
- Visited by Wise Men when 2 to 5 months old
- Fled to Egypt when 2 to 5 months old
- Returned to live in Nazareth when 1 year old
- His parents thought He was lost when 12 years old
- Baptized by John when 30 years old
- Some important events of His three-year ministry:
  - → Tempted in the wilderness
  - → Moved from Nazareth to Capernaum
  - Called His disciples
  - → Preached the Sermon on the Mount
  - Performed many miracles
  - Sent out His disciples to heal and teach
  - → Warned about persecution
  - Told many parables
  - → Heard of the death of John the Baptist
  - → More miracles and teaching
  - ➡ Transfigured, Moses and Elijah appeared with Him
  - More miracles and teaching
  - → Welcomed into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday
  - → Taught many things on Holy Tuesday
  - ➡ Instituted the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.
  - ➡ Arrested, tried, crucified, and died on Good Friday
  - ➡ Raised to life on the third day, Easter Sunday
  - → Ascended into heaven 40 days after Easter

#### **Background:**

- During Jesus' life and ministry He fulfilled many OT prophecies, taught with authority, and did many mighty miracles; all such things prove that He is the Son of God, the Promised Savior of the world!
- 2. In today's true story, Jesus will show us that He has an unlimited supply of whatever we need!

## **Jesus Feeds Thousands:**

1. The setting: <sup>1</sup> ...Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), <sup>2</sup> and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. <sup>3</sup> Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. // Since Jesus had done so many miraculous healings, many were drawn to Him to see and benefit from His miracles!

- 2. <u>Jesus tests Philip</u>: <sup>4</sup> The Jewish Passover Festival was near. <sup>5</sup> When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" <sup>6</sup> He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do. <sup>7</sup> Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!" // With Philip's answer, we are made aware of the GREAT EXPENSE of feeding that large number of people!
- 3. An unreasonable solution: <sup>8</sup> Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, <sup>9</sup> "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" //
  Through Andrew the GREAT DIFFICULTY of feeding so many is made known!
- 4. <u>Jesus' miracle</u>: <sup>10</sup> Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). <sup>11</sup> Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted [not just a bite]. He did the same with the fish. <sup>12</sup> When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." <sup>13</sup> So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

  // Enough was left over to provide for each disciple!
- 5. God through Moses had promised to send a great Prophet: <sup>14</sup> After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." // Regarding that Prophet, God said, "I myself will call to account anyone who does not listen to my words that the prophet speaks in my name" (Deut. 18:19).
