- → By Profession of Faith: Anyone who has already been confirmed as a Lutheran but is not a current member of a LCMS congregation may join by profession of faith (please request an application).
- → <u>By Confirmation</u>: Complete our Bible Basics course; then participate in the rite of confirmation. Let the pastor know of your desire.

Bible Basics Course



Lutherans in General

There are approximately 40 different Lutheran Church Bodies in North America. Some hold very closely to God's word, the Bible, which is our position at Bethlehem (see our "Welcome" brochure for more about Bethlehem). Others are using a different method of Bible interpretation, which can lead to different teachings – some of which are contrary to Scripture.

Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod

That is the name of our Church Body; we go by the letters: LCMS. The LCMS has approximately 2 million members in 6,000 congregations across the United States.

The LCMS is the *oldest* and *second largest* Lutheran Church Body in the United States. The LCMS was established in 1847 by German immigrants.

Bethlehem Lutheran Church

Bethlehem is one of those 6,000 congregations. Bethlehem, Parma was established in 1904 by members of St. Mark, Cleveland. Bethlehem has approximately 200 members.

These are some key ingredients of Bethlehem Lutheran Church:

- We base all we believe, teach, and confess on a careful interpretation of the Bible.
- → We encourage every member to be faithful in daily devotion, weekly attendance, and living God's Word.

- → God is our Father and Jesus is our Savior, so we are one forever family.
- → We are small enough to be personal, but large enough to accommodate the needs of most believers.
- → We offer various fellowship and service opportunities.
- We desire to reach out to those who do not yet know Jesus as Savior and Lord!

Attendance Prior to Joining

Prior to becoming a member, everyone is encouraged to attend Divine Service at least six times and meet with the pastor to get acquainted. Doing so will help you get to know us better!

This is our regular schedule:

- → Saturdays:
 - Bible Class 3:00
 - o Divine Service 4:00
- → Sundays:
 - o Divine Service 9:00
 - Bible Classes and Sunday School 10:30

We also have many festival services during the year – see the "Join Us" brochure for the details.

Two Types of Membership

- → <u>Baptized</u> All members are baptized members.
- → Communicant All members who have been confirmed as Lutherans are also communicant members. (For those who have not yet been confirmed as Lutherans, confirmation takes place after the completion of our Bible Basics course see the back for more info.)

Become a Baptized Member

- → <u>By Baptism</u>: Please ◆obtain a Baptism Information packet by our main entrance, ◆follow the instructions in the letter, and ◆schedule a meeting with the pastor. Everyone baptized at Bethlehem LC automatically becomes a baptized member.
- → By Transfer: Previously baptized children and youth (17 years old or younger), whose parents become communicant members, can become baptized / communicant members along with their parents.

Become a Communicant Member
