1 Timothy 2:1-4 ESV

For Whom Christians Should Pray and Why!

Wednesday, November 27 at 7 PM
Thanksgiving Eve – 2013

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: In 1 Timothy chapter 1, Paul warned Timothy about false teachers who have swerved away from ⁵ "a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith." In other words, for teaching to be effective, *it must be God's uncompromised truth!*

Then, at the beginning of chapter 2, Paul instructed Timothy about praying. As we now focus on vv. 1-4, we will learn how AND why to improve our praying +in our services and +in our daily Christian lives. Let us also take note of the close connection between *praying* and *giving thanks!*

- 1. Praying For Others So WE Benefit: First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, [WHY?] that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. //
 - a. Paul taught Timothy to pray for all people in certain ways:
 - i. <u>Supplications</u> (δεήσεις): That word describes how we speak to God when we have a need or are in misery. For

example, the angel said to Zechariah, "...your <u>prayer</u> [supplication] has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John." (Luke 1:13 ESV)

- ii. Prayers (προσευχὰς): That is the standard word for speaking to God; such speaking is also a form of worship: We ask things of God because we trust in Him as our LORD and Savior! Jesus said: "...whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith." (Matthew 21:22 ESV)
- iii. <u>Intercessions</u> (ἐντεύξεις): The word has the idea of going to God in prayer for the benefit of another person or thing. Paul wrote of intercession in this passage:

 "...everything created by God is good... for it is made holy by the word of God and <u>prayer [intercession]."</u> (1 Tim. 4:4-5 ESV)
- iv. <u>Thanksgivings</u> (εὐχαριστίας): On this eve of our National Day of Thanksgiving, how should we as God's forgiven children think about our giving of thanks?
 - 1. Jesus gave thanks to the Father at His final Passover celebration after He took the bread and after He took the cup, so let us always give thanks to God for His gift of eternal life!
 - 2. Whenever we speak to God with supplications, prayers, or

intercessions — we should also include thanksgivings (Phil. 4:6-7)! No matter how difficult the situation, there is always reason to give thanks! Therefore, the Bible says: "in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1Th 5:18 NAS)

- b. No one should be left out of our prayers, not even our enemies, but kings and those in high or powerful positions should definitely be included. For those who are doing well, we pray for God's continued blessing upon them; for those who are doing evil, we pray for God to call them to repentance.
- c. We pray with a **purpose** "for kings and all who are in high positions," even for all people, so that we may lead God-pleasing lives. Dr. Kretzmann wrote: "If the government makes proper use of the various functions entrusted to it by God... then the result will be that [Christians] can lead a quiet, tranquil, peaceable life, in all godliness, in the right worshiping of God, and in all honesty, in good conduct toward all men. [Then he adds:] The Christian religion, which the believers confess and profess, must find its expression in daily life." (NT: II:375)
- 2. Praying For Others So THEY Benefit: ³ This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴ who desires all people to be saved and to come to the

knowledge of the truth. // God wants us to see how everything in our lives is interconnected; as it doesn't work to be an arm-chair quarterback, so it doesn't work to be a Sunday morning believer! Think about this development:

- a. God moves us *from sinners to saints* through Jesus!
- b. Saints follow God's Word by praying for all people, especially for those in high positions.
- c. God guides those in high positions so that we can freely live and speak for Jesus!
- d. God is pleased with such living and speaking.
- e. God uses such living and speaking of His Word to bring others to the knowledge of the truth and His gift of eternal salvation!

Conclusion: Since we have a direct line to God through Jesus (1 Tim. 2:5), let us faithfully offer supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings for +our president and all high officials, +our state and community, +our congregation and family members, and +all who do not yet know Jesus!

Finally, since God is the Actual Giver of every good gift, may our prayers of thanksgiving ever-arise to Him until we are finally with Him!
