Text: Luke 11:1-13 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today's topic is prayer – talking to God with our words and thoughts. I hope we all pray; today we will focus on being persistent in our prayers.

What is the meaning of persistent? Continuing firmly or stubbornly in a course of action despite difficulty or opposition. It's typical to pray for a while, then give up. But, today, let us be encouraged to be persistent, firm, stubborn!

Today's text is the beginning of **Luke chapter 11**, which includes two points on prayer – before we come to the topic of persistence.

- 1. The Reason for the Lord's Prayer: 1 It happened that while Jesus was praying in a certain place, after He had finished, one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John also taught his disciples."
 - a. <u>Jesus was praying</u> probably out loud.

- b. One of His disciples probably one of the 70 who were sent out two-by-two ahead of Jesus and possibly a former disciple of John the Baptizer so **not** one of the 12, and **not** one who was with Jesus when He preached the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7).
- c. <u>As John taught his disciples</u> Apparently John taught his disciples to pray certain prayers, so this disciple asked Jesus to do the same for His own disciples.
- 2. The Shorter Version of the Lord's Prayer: ² And He said to them, "When you pray, say: 'Father, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. ³ 'Give us each day our daily bread. ⁴ 'And forgive us our sins, For we ourselves also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation.'"
 - a. Since Jesus did not use *the exact form* from His original teaching in Matthew 6, we should understand that there is freedom in how we pray the Lord's Prayer:
 - i. We can use the Matthew version.
 - ii. We can use the Luke version.
 - iii. We can expand on each petition, etc.
 - b. Notice the general order:
 - i. We address the Father and mention a key characteristic: holy is Your name.
 - ii. Then we focus on God's kingdom: ♦we are members through Jesus and ♦that membership is more important than anything in this world!
 - iii. Then we come to our physical needs.
 - iv. Then the great importance of *receiving* and *extending* forgiveness.

- v. Then we seek help to avoid temptation and sin.
- 3. An Example of Persistence: ⁵ Then [Jesus] said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and goes to him at midnight and says to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; ⁶ for a friend of mine has come to me from a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; ⁷ and from inside he answers and says, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been shut and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you *anything*.' ⁸ "I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him *anything* because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will get up and give him as much as he needs.
 - a. <u>Imagine</u>: It's midnight, you're in bed, you have no food in your house, and a close friend, after a long and difficult journey, has just arrived at your house. You need food for him, so you are knocking on a neighbor's door at midnight. He says, "Go away!" But you keep asking and seeking and knocking! You are persistent!
 - b. Have you ever started to push a cart at a store, only to realize you took the one with the squeaky wheel:

 squeak... squeak... Ever heard this phrase?

 The squeaky wheel gets the grease! Why? Because the squeaking keeps calling for oil! So, the persistent neighbor kept asking for bread until he got it!

4. Encouragement to be Persistent:

a. ⁹ "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. // And why should we keep asking, seeking, and knocking with our prayers? Jesus told us: b. ¹⁰ "For everyone who asks, receives; and he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, it will be opened. // How can we remember the order? A-S-K: Ask, Seek, Knock; then get ready to ⇒receive, ⇒find, and ⇒have the way opened!

5. The Goodness of Our Heavenly Father:

- a. ¹¹ "Now suppose one of you fathers is asked by his son for a fish; he will not give him a snake instead of a fish, will he? ¹² "Or *if* he is asked for an egg, he will not give him a scorpion, will he? // Certainly, NO to both!
- b. ¹³ "If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him? // Understand: The HS is the greatest gift and, as believers in Jesus, we have the HS! So, our heavenly Father will also give us everything else as well!

Take Aways<mark>:</mark>

- <u>Truth</u> Jesus is the One Mediator between us and God (1 Tim. 2:5).
- <u>Relevance</u> Bible reading and praying keep us close to our Father in heaven.
- Inspiration Keep being persistent and He will answer!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, what a HUGE privilege to know Your Son and speak to You through prayer; make us faithful, persistent, and specific; then grant us patience and peace!

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
