Text: Matthew 3:1-12 NAS 1995 Advent Wednesdays: Services at 11 & 7; Free Meals at 12 & 6

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: During the current church year, which began last week, many of our gospel readings will be from the Gospel according to Matthew.

At the end of Matthew chapter 2, Joseph, Mary, and the infant Jesus had just returned from Egypt and settled in Nazareth. Now, as we move into chapter 3, we have jumped ahead about 29 years to the beginning of the ministry of John the Baptizer.

As we move through this text, keep in mind that Advent means coming, and Jesus' coming calls for repentance!

 The Emphasis of John's Ministry: ¹ Now in those days [at the beginning of his ministry] John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea, saying, ² "<u>Repent,</u> for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

- a. <u>Unrepentant</u>: In John's day, *most Jews were unrepentant*; spiritually, *they were like a wilderness*.
- b. <u>Highly skilled</u>: Then and today, we create our own standards for godliness; for example, some might say:
 I haven't murdered anyone, I am a decent person, and I go to church, so I must be a Christian.
- c. <u>Repent</u>: Let us *use **God's** standards, *admit our sins,
 *be sorry, *trust in Jesus, and *make a 180-degree turn! <u>Why</u>? Membership in the kingdom of heaven is essential; *only repentant people are members!*
- 2. A Prophecy about John: ³ For this is the one referred to by Isaiah the prophet [in chapter 40] when he said, "THE VOICE OF ONE CRYING IN THE WILDERNESS, 'MAKE READY THE WAY OF THE LORD, MAKE HIS PATHS STRAIGHT!" // Isaiah prophesied about John; then, at the right time, six months before the beginning of Jesus' ministry, John began calling people to repent. Then and now, the HS works repentance through law and gospel!
- 3. A Description of John: ⁴ Now John himself had a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey. // John lived off the land; his time and efforts were not consumed by the busyness and pleasures of the world. May the Lord grant us lives that are *simple and *centered in Christ.
- 4. God's Work through John: ⁵ Then Jerusalem was going out to him, and all Judea and all the district around the Jordan; ⁶ and they were being baptized by him in the Jordan River, as they confessed their sins. // God convinced many people that John was a true prophet, so multitudes *went, *heard, *confessed, and *believed.

- 5. When People are Repentant, it will be Obvious: ⁷ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them,
 - a. <u>Align your life with your confession</u>: "You brood of vipers, who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸ Therefore <u>bear fruit in keeping with</u> repentance; ⁹ and do not suppose that you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham for our father'; for I say to you that from these stones God is able to raise up children to Abraham." // By coming to John for baptism, they were saying they were repentant but they had no evidence. John challenged them to show him their 180-degree turn. It is essential that our targets for living agree with God's targets for living:
 - i. <u>Divine Service</u>: For some, *their target is Christmas Eve and Easter*, but God's target *is for us to attend every week* (Ex. 20:8).
 - ii. <u>Forgiveness</u>: For some, *their target is to forgive those who are sorry*, but God's target for us *is to fully forgive everyone* (Mt. 6:14-15).
 - iii. <u>Giving</u>: For some, their target is a random number, but God's target for us is to show our trust and thanks by faithfully giving a tithe (Mal. 3:8-10).
 May our LIVING clearly show our REPENTANCE!
 - b. <u>Act NOW</u>: ¹⁰ "The axe is already laid at the root of the trees; therefore, every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." // <u>What</u> trees? The ones bearing no fruit. When you use an axe, ⇒you lay it where you want to chop, then ⇒you swing it for the purpose of chopping! John was saying: ACT NOW before you are chopped and burned!

- 6. John Compares His Baptism with Jesus' Baptism: ¹¹ "As for me, I baptize you with <u>water</u> for repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you with <u>the Holy Spirit and fire</u>." // In both baptisms *the HS was at work*:
 - a. John: He preached ➡ the HS worked ➡ people were repentant (sorry, trusting in the Messiah, turning from sin) ➡ baptized and ➡ received God's forgiveness.
 - b. <u>Jesus</u>: He received the HS from the Father and poured Him out on the Day of Pentecost *as fire* (Acts 2:33).
- 7. John Points Ahead to the Final Judgment: ¹² "[Jesus'] winnowing fork is <u>in His hand</u>, and He will thoroughly clear His threshing floor; and He will gather His <u>wheat</u> into the barn, but He will burn up the <u>chaff</u> with <u>unquenchable</u> fire."
 - a. In His hand: Jesus is ready to act at any moment!
 - b. <u>Wheat and chaff</u>: The wheat are repentant ones; *their lives have made a radical turn* **AND IT SHOWS**. The chaff may go through some right motions, but their hearts are unrepentant, *and* **GOD SEES THEIR HEARTS**.
 - c. <u>Unquenchable</u>: Fire that cannot be put out

Conclusion: God is calling all of us to repent *in every way that* repentance is necessary in our lives. Then He is calling us to
trust in Jesus and be sure that we are righteous in His sight.

Let Us Pray: Father in heaven, since our targets do not always agree with Your targets, \$show us Your will and \$move us to make every necessary turn from sin to doing Your will!
