Past - Present - Future

Introduction: Dear friends: Last Thursday, **11/13/25**, was the **121**st Anniversary of this Congregation (1904 – 2025). <u>Today</u>, let's consider some of our <u>past</u>, <u>present</u>, and <u>future</u>.

- 1. Past: A brief history of Bethlehem Parma:
 - a. <u>8/20/1899</u>: **Pastor Ungemach**, of St. Mark, Cleveland, began services in **Parma** at the <u>old town hall</u>.
 - b. <u>12/25/1901</u>: Pr. Ungemach began services at the <u>old</u> <u>schoolhouse</u> on Pleasant Valley, near State Road.
 - c. 6/15/1904: Eleven families purchased property at State and Pleasant Valley for \$65. The total cost for finishing and furnishing the first building was \$720: light by kerosene lamps, heat by a pot-bellied stove.
 - d. <u>11/13/1904</u>: **First Service**, **new building**: <u>language</u> German, <u>men & boys</u> right, <u>women & girls</u> left.
 - e. <u>3/22/1908</u>: **Name**: Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church U.A.C. (Unaltered Augsburg Confession).
 - f. Over the Decades: Served by **14** pastors and **4** vicars. Dual parish w/ St. John Independence: **1910 to 1948**.
 - g. Mid 1960's: The congregation purchased the <u>current</u> **property** (14.5 acres) and built the <u>current</u> **building**.

- 2. Present: We are thankful for our *finances and *facility, but our focus is on things of eternal significance:
 - a. The Triune God The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit: The Three Persons worked together to ◆create all things and ◆save us from our sins!
 - b. The Holy Bible God's word of truth: It was given to
 ◆teach us vital things and ◆call us into God's kingdom
 for example:
 - The Origin: God created all things The Father worked through the Son (Heb. 1:1-2; Jn. 1:3), along with the Holy Spirit (Gen. 1:2)!
 - ii. The Fall Into Sin: **Adam and Eve listened to Satan rather than God** the results:
 - 1. Immediate spiritual death (Gen. 2:16-17).
 - 2. Eventual physical death (Gen. 5:5).
 - 3. <u>Nature frustrated</u> (Rom. 8:20) *having been pulled down from its perfect state*.
 - 4. Sin and death passed to all future people (Rom. 5:12).
 - iii. The Savior was Promised: He would be a future descendant of the woman He would *defeat Satan (Gen. 3:15), *reverse his work (1Jo. 3:8), and *restore all things (Rev. 21:5)!
 - iv. The OT Era: It kept revealing the great need for the Messiah (Gen. 6:5) – It kept pointing to the Coming Messiah through →the Sabbath day (Ex. 20:8), →the sacrificial system (Lev. 1-7), and →the seven annual festivals (Lev. 23).

- v. The Savior's Arrival: The Son of God put on the flesh of Mary He came:
 - 1. According to God's plan (Gal. 4:4)!
 - 2. <u>He lived as our sinless substitute</u>, perfectly fulfilling the Law (2Co. 5:21; Matt. 5:17)!
 - 3. <u>He received our sins and the eternal</u> <u>punishment we deserve</u> (Is. 53:6; 1Jo. 2:2)!
 - 4. He opened the one way from us to God (1Pe. 3:18; John 14:6; Acts 4:12)!
- vi. The Gift of Salvation: It has always been received by grace through faith:
 - By grace Though we have rebelled against God (Rom. 3:23), He *loves us (Jn 3:16),
 *makes us aware of our lost condition (Rom. 3:20), and *calls us to turn from our goodness to Jesus' finished work (Phil. 3:9)!
 - 2. **Through faith** By the Spirit through the word, God gives us the gift of faith by which we trust in Jesus as our Savior (Jam. 1:18; 1Pe. 1:23)!
- vii. Being a Disciple: **That means to learn from Jesus** Then ♦apply what we learn and ♦share that learning with someone else (2Ti. 2:2).
- 3. Future: Challenges and Awareness:
 - a. Challenges: Per the 2024 Church and Mission Stats¹:
 - i. "Three out of four churches are currently dying."

- ii. "42% of pastors considered quitting... in 2022."
- iii. The decline of Christian affiliation by generation:
 "Builders (before 46) 65%... Boomers (46-64) 35%...
 Gen X (65-79) 24%... Millennials (1980-2000) 15%."
- b. <u>Awareness</u>: Congregations *normally* follow a threepart life-cycle, *with 20-30 years per cycle*:
 - i. Part 1 Outreach: The congregation is active in reaching new people by *inviting them, *sharing God's truth, *growing their finances, and *constructing their own building.
 - ii. Part 2 Ease: The congregation begins to *relax,
 *give thanks for a balanced budget, *stop
 reaching out, and *focus on those who attend.
 - iii. <u>Part 3 Decline</u>: Since most of the reaching and inviting stopped decades earlier, the congregation is now inching toward death.
 - iv. What Is Critical for Bethlehem? To never stop

 inviting and never stop
 sharing God's saving truth. We should also see ourselves as disciples −
 learning from Jesus AND *sharing what we are learning with someone else − by using our sermons, studies, and/or brochures.

Let Us Pray: Dear LORD! TY for sustaining this congregation for the past 121 years! Going forward, help each of us to be a disciple by *continuing to learn and *passing what we learn to another person. Keep us, Guide us, Use us to Your glory!
