Mary Is Pregnant! But Joseph Is Not the Father!

Text: Matthew 1:18-25 NAS 2020

By the Holy Spirit: Let's **♦**understand and **♦**apply it in our lives!

Chr. Eve 4; Chr. Day 10; New Year's Eve 4; New Year's Day 10

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Things of *temporal* significance sometimes catch our attention, for example:

- The prediction of a snowstorm!
- A sale at a favorite store, offering 80% off!

If our attention is grabbed, then we will react — ▶by staying home when it's snowing or ▶by going shopping to get a deal.

Today, our gospel reading is **the Christmas story according to Matthew**. God is trying to catch our attention:

- To cause us to stop and think!
- To help us know He will keep every single promise!
- To grip us to the core regarding death and hell!
- To make us open to repenting and believing!
- To move us to celebrate a Christ-centered Christmas!

- 1. Awkward: ¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah [the One whom God anointed with the Holy Spirit after He was baptized] was as follows: when His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be pregnant by the Holy Spirit.
 - a. <u>Betrothed</u>: Lenski: "The Jewish betrothal was a solemn promise before witnesses [Ruth 4:9-12], embodying the essentials of the marriage vow. No further promises followed." // They were married!
 - b. <u>Before they came together</u>: Between being betrothed and coming together there was a gap of about 12 months. During that time, they were ▶not to live together ▶nor have sexual relations.
 - c. Found to be pregnant by the Holy Spirit: Mary had no way of proving her innocence, and she could have been punished by death (Deut. 22:23-24). Sadly, in the US, at least 70% of people choose, prior to marriage, to ◆live in sin and ◆place themselves under God's divine judgment. Even after marriage, few repent.
- 2. Dangerous: ¹⁹ And her husband Joseph, since he was <u>a</u> righteous man and <u>did not want to disgrace her</u>, planned to send her away secretly.
 - a. <u>A righteous man</u>: Joseph believed in the coming Messiah, so he lived according to God's Law. <u>Today</u>, Christians trust in Jesus and follow the Bible!
 - b. <u>Did not want to disgrace her</u>: It would be *bad enough* if Joseph and Mary had sex before coming together. It would be *much worse* if *while betrothed* Mary had sex with another man. Joseph could have stated that openly; instead, *he planned a secret divorce*.

- 3. Explanation: ²⁰ But when he had thought this over, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, <u>do not be afraid to take</u>

 Mary as your wife; for <u>the Child who has been conceived</u> in her is of the Holy Spirit.
 - a. <u>Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife</u>: The child living in her womb is not the child of another man.
 - b. The Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit: Joseph did not completely understand then, and neither do we today, but he *trusted the words of the holy angel and *accepted the explanation. // Let us always trust God's word, even when we cannot fully understand it!
- 4. Wonderful: ²¹ She will give birth to a Son; and you shall name Him Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."
 - a. <u>Mary</u>: As the <u>mother</u>, she was to *carry, *give birth to, and *raise the Child.
 - b. <u>Joseph</u>: As the <u>legal father</u>, he was to name the child Jesus.
 - c. <u>Jesus</u>: As the <u>Son of God</u>, His task was to *perfectly follow God's will and *die on a cross, for the purpose of saving us from our sins!
- 5. Fulfillment: ²² Now all this took place so that what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet would be fulfilled: ²³ "Behold, <u>The Virgin Will Conceive and Give Birth To A Son</u>, and <u>They Shall Name Him Immanuel</u>," which translated means, "God with Us."

- a. THE VIRGIN WILL CONCEIVE AND GIVE BIRTH TO A SON: In today's OT reading (Isaiah 7:10-16), a virgin conceived in the normal way to assure King Ahaz of the LORD's help against his enemies.
- b. THEY SHALL NAME HIM IMMANUEL: That name applies here to Jesus, He is **God With Us** to take away our sins. **Do you** believe it? **Are you** trusting in Jesus alone for your entrance into heaven?
- 6. Obedience: ²⁴ And <u>Joseph</u> awoke from his sleep and <u>did</u> as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took *Mary* as his wife, ²⁵ but <u>kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son;</u> and he named Him Jesus.
 - a. <u>Joseph... did as the angel of the Lord commanded</u>
 <u>him</u>: Angels, *like pastors*, are messengers. They are tasked with speaking God's messages, *not their own*.
 - b. Kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son: The text implies normal husband and wife relations after Jesus was born. The people of Nazareth said of Jesus: Matt. 13:55-56 "Is not His mother called Mary, and His brothers, James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? And His sisters, are they not all with us?
 - c. <u>He named Him Jesus</u>: Which means: *The Lord saves!* He did His work for you! Have you received Him?

Let Us Pray: Dear LORD, TYSM for keeping Your promise to send Your Son! Please get everyone's attention soon and lead all lost ones to repent and believe!

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
